



The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of **the late John Daley, Pvt. 1/c, Company L, 103rd Infantry, is Grave 28, Row 31, Block A, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France.**

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open







Case of Private First-class John Daley.

1. In reply to your letter of May 6th, forwarded by our branch office at Hoboken, New Jersey, you are advised that notation has been made of your desire and that of your mother that the remains of your brother, the late Private First-class John Daley, Company "L", 103rd Infantry, be permanently interred in France. The remains of your brother are interred in the French Military Cemetery at Neufchateau, Department of Vosges. It is not known definitely at this time whether this cemetery will be permanently retained by the French Government, but this office has this date requested information from the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q.M.G. in Europe, as to whether or not the French Government intends to retain this cemetery. Upon receipt of this advice, you will be immediately advised. In the event it is retained and you desire the remains permanently interred therein, it is necessary that the legal next of kin execute and return to this office the enclosed G.R.S. Form #123, which releases the United States Government of the future care of the grave.

2. In the event you desire the remains of this soldier permanently interred in France and do not wish to assume the future care of the grave, the body will, according to present schedule, be removed to the Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, where the grave will be perpetually cared for by the United States Government.







My dear Madam:

Your letter of November 24th to Major Knowlton, concerning the body of your brother, John Daley, has been referred to me for reply. His death was caused by Broncho Pneumonia, in the line of duty. You have probably received my letter of November 17th on this time, which states that he was buried in the French Military Cemetery at Neufchateau, and that the grave is marked by a cross containing his name, rank, regiment and date of death.

I regret to be obliged to tell you that the authorities have established an invariable rule that no bodies of our soldiers shall be returned to the United States during the continuance of the present War. However, the body of your brother is buried in a place of which this Department has charge, and the grave will be taken care of, so that it may be located at any time in the future it may be desired.

This is as much as I am able to write you on the subject; and while these decisions, that are made in war times, seem to bear very heavily on many people, they are made necessary by the great burdens and difficulties attended upon the operations of armies in the field.
