This reply will assure your Government that no worthy Mother or Widow has failed to receive its offer in commemoration of a loved one departed, and will greatly assist in making the necessary preparations for those of them who wish to take advantage of the privilege.

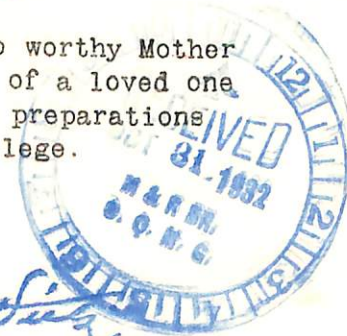

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

IT IS REQUESTED THAT YOU GIVE THE MATTER YOUR MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BEFORE REACHING A DECISION, BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS IS THE LAST OPPORTUNITY YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE THE TRIP AT GOVERNMENT EXPENSE.

In order to assure proper and satisfactory accommodations for the mothers and widows making the journey in 1933, reservations for steamship transportation must be made by this office several months in advance. It is requested that you answer the questions below by writing "Yes" or "No" or "Undecided" in the blank space following the question. When you have answered the question, sign your name and return this sheet in the enclosed addressed envelope which requires no postage. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY, as it is essential that the information be in this office promptly.





Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of December 10, 1929, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929, a copy of which is enclosed for your information.

You are advised that the above mentioned Act does not contain any provision which will permit any member of the family other than the mother or widow to make the pilgrimage at the expense of the Government. It is regretted to have to advise, therefore, that a member of your family is not eligible under the law to accompany you on this pilgrimage.

You are assured that thoroughly competent personnel will be assigned by the War Department to provide for the needs and welfare of those mothers and widows making the journey.

Any arrangements which a member of your family desires to make to accompany you on the pilgrimage to your son's grave in the Meuse-Ar-gonne American Cemetery in France, must be made personally. You will be advised the date of your sailing and the name of the vessel far enough in advance, it is believed, to permit of communication with the steam-ship company in an effort to secure accommodations on the same boat.

No data has been assembled by this office relative to the probable cost to individuals desiring to make the pilgrimage at their own expense. It is therefore impossible to advise what the cost of the trip would be.

It will be appreciated if you will complete and return the enclosed questionnaire, in order that we may complete the records of this office. A self-addressed envelope requiring no postage is enclosed for your use.

There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.

IT IS REQUESTED THAT YOU GIVE THE MATTER YOUR MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BEFORE REACHING A DECISION, BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS IS THE LAST OPPORTUNITY YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE THE TRIP AT GOVERNMENT EXPENSE.

In order to assure proper and satisfactory accommodations for the mothers and widows making the journey in 1933, reservations for steamship transportation must be made by this office several months in advance. It is requested that you answer the questions below by writing "Yes" or "No" or "Undecided" in the blank space following the question. When you have answered the question, sign your name and return this sheet in the enclosed addressed envelope which requires no postage. PLEASE DO NOT DELAY, as it is essential that the information be in this office promptly.

This letter is being sent to all eligible mothers and widows who did not make the pilgrimage during the years 1930, 1931 or 1932. There is enclosed a circular of information WHICH YOU SHOULD READ VERY CAREFULLY BEFORE MAKING YOUR DECISION.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of December 10, 1929, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929, a copy of which is enclosed for your information.

You are advised that the above mentioned Act does not contain any provision which will permit any member of the family other than the mother or widow to make the pilgrimage at the expense of the Government. It is regretted to have to advise, therefore, that a member of your family is not eligible under the law to accompany you on this pilgrimage.

You are assured that thoroughly competent personnel will be assigned by the War Department to provide for the needs and welfare of those mothers and widows making the journey.

Any arrangements which a member of your family desires to make to accompany you on the pilgrimage to your son's grave in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery in France, must be made personally. You will be advised the date of your sailing and the name of the vessel far enough in advance, it is believed, to permit of communication with the steamship company in an effort to secure accommodations on the same boat.

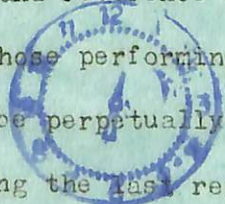

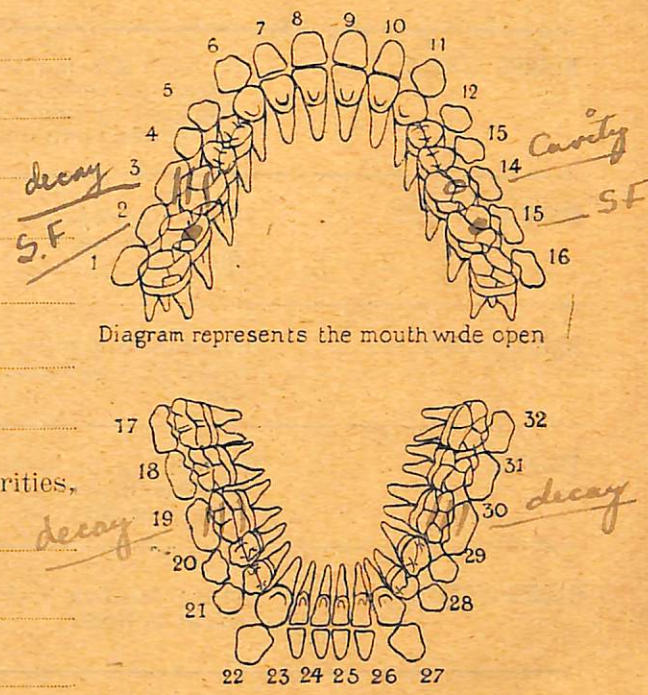

2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave.
