Dear Madam:

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.


IT IS REQUESTED THAT YOU GIVE THE MATTER YOUR MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BEFORE REACHING A DECISION, BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS IS THE LAST OPPORTUNITY YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE THE TRIP AT GOVERNMENT EXPENSE.


Reference is made to previous correspondence with this office relative to a pilgrimage to the grave of your son, the late Private Edward J. Daly.

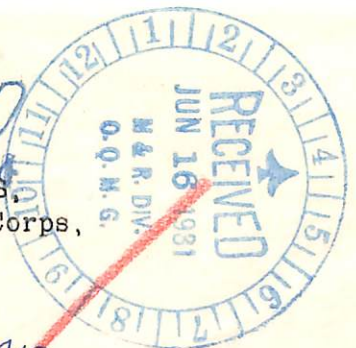



The Act of Congress which provides for pilgrimages to cemeteries in Europe by mothers and widows of members of the military or naval forces of the United States who died in the military or naval service at any time between April 5, 1917 and July 1, 1921, and whose remains are now interred in such cemeteries, all necessary expenses of which pilgrimages are to be paid by the United States Government, requires that the Secretary of War make an investigation and submit the results of such investigation in a report to Congress not later than December 15, 1929. 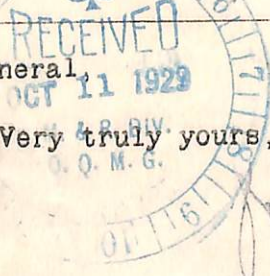

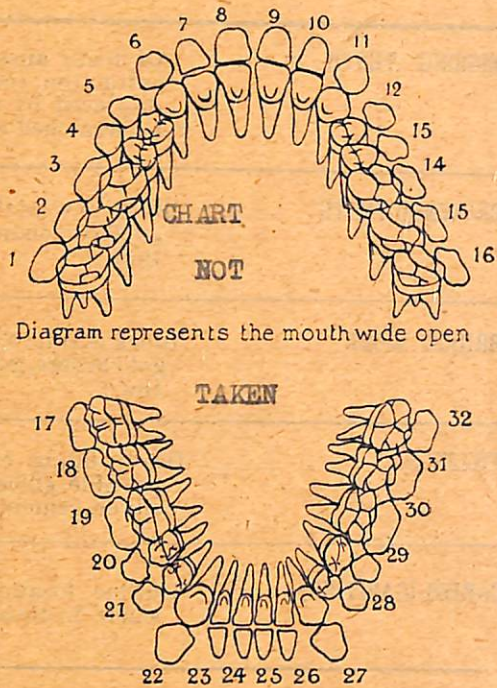


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

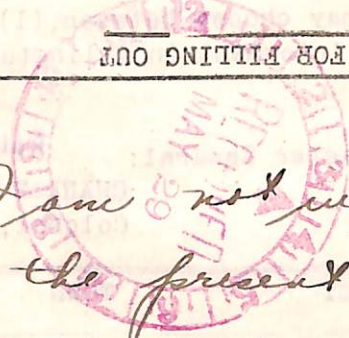

Disposition of remains.

1. The records of this office indicate that you desire the body of your son, the late Private Edward J. Daly, 33rd Aero Squadron, permanently interred in its present resting place, in Grave 115, American Cemetery at Issoudun, Department of Indre. This is a temporary American Cemetery and will be abandoned, therefore, it will be necessary for the body to be removed.

2. The remains may be removed to a nearby permanent French Cemetery in which event, it will be necessary for you to execute and return to this office the inclosed release, which relieves the Government of the responsibility for the future care and maintenance of the grave site after reburial has been effected and formal release given.

3. In the event you do not desire to assume the responsibility for the future care and maintenance of the grave, the body may be removed to one of the permanent American Cemeteries in France, referred to in paragraph #9, of the inclosed Cemeterial Division Bulletin No. 10-G-W. The Government will permanently maintain these cemeteries in the same manner as National Cemeteries in this country are maintained.

4. In view of this information it is requested that you advise this office immediately whether you wish the body of the deceased interred in a nearby permanent French Cemetery or removed to one of the permanent American Cemeteries in France.
