Your attention is invited to the enclosed copy of an Act of Congress approved March 2, 1929, entitled an Act "To enable the mothers and widows of the deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces now interred in the cemeteries of Europe to make a pilgrimage to these cemeteries".

The records of this office show that you are the father of the late Peter DeFalco, Bug. Co.M, 327th Inf., whose remains are now interred in the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Meuse, France.

Will you please advise this office whether or not he is survived by a mother or widow who is entitled under the provisions of the above quoted Act, to make the pilgrimage, and if so, will you please furnish the full names and addresses of the mother and widow in order that action may be taken to extend invitations to them to make the pilgrimage. Both mothers and widows are entitled to make the pilgrimage.

Your attention is particularly invited to Section 4 of the enclosed Act, which defines the terms "mother" and "widow". If the relative is a stepmother, mother through adoption, or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the decedent, a statement as to her relationship is requested. If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.







Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.
5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".
 (b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. 6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

In reply to your letter of February 6, 1923, the Quartermaster General desires that you be advised there is no data in this office by which you could be furnished an estimate of the cost of removing the remains of your late brother, Bugler Peter de Falco, Co. M, 327th Infantry from its present burial place in France to Italy.

The Quartermaster General desires that receipt be acknowledged of your letter of January 10th 1923, wherein you request that the remains of your late son, Bugler Peter De Falco, Co.M, 327th Inf., be shipped to Italy for burial.

The records of this office contain a request from Mr. Anthony De Falco, 22 Seal St. Dunkirk, N.Y. (uncle) whose name was given by the deceased as the person to be notified in case of emergency, that the remains of his nephew be permanently buried in France and instructions have been issued to the European Office accordingly.

It is regretted the Department cannot favorably consider your request at this late date, as under a ruling of the Secretary of War, no changes in requests for bodies to remain buried in France in favor of return to this country, were accepted after August 15th 1921, owing to the nearing completion of the work. Should you however, desire the body shipped to Italy at your expense, the Department will consent thereto.

The remains of your late son have been transferred to their final resting place in Grave 38, Row 40, Block F, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery at Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of Meuse, France. This cemetery has been designated for permanent retention and you are assured the grave of your late son will be marked by an appropriate headstone of marble and will be maintained in a most careful and reverent manner.
