"I do not know Deines first name, we had but one in the outfit and he was a cook. I was an eye witness. This was at the Marne July 15th or 16th. The shelling started at 11:30 at night; it was the next morning when I saw him half buried in dugout. A shell blew up the mess hall and everything that was near by. He was a tall slender feller, quiet but well liked by every one in the company. He joined us at Camp Merritt had come from Camp Funston and lived in the West, I think".





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.






This reply will assure your Government that no worthy Mother or Widow has failed to receive its offer in commemoration of a loved one departed, and will greatly assist in making the necessary preparations for those of them who wish to take advantage of the privilege.


