Information has been furnished this office which indicates that you may be eligible to make the pilgrimage to the grave of the late Dominick Deluca under the provisions of the Act of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930. Section 4 (a) of the Act has been amended to read in part as follows: "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to the soldier, sailor, or marine becoming eighteen years of age."

In order to satisfy legal requirements it will be necessary for you to furnish as proof of your relationship in loco parentis the affidavits of at least two persons not related to you.

It is regretted that your letter of July 29, 1929, could not have been acknowledged before this. However, the voluminous amount of correspondence in this office incident to the Act of March 2, 1929, and the fact that an investigation must be made in each case has caused the delay.

Your inquiry for Mrs. Theresa Scrapino, 621 W. Coal Street, Shenandoah, Penna., as to whether her brother, the late Private Dominick Deluca, Company A, 146th Infantry, who is buried in the Meuse Argonne American Cemetery in France, left any property has been referred to the General Accounting Office, Claims Division, for reply. You will no doubt receive a reply from that office within a reasonable length of time.

It is assumed that Mrs. Scrapino desires the privilege of making the pilgrimage to her brother's grave under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act, which states in part "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces for the year prior to the commencement of his service in such forces".

It has been held that within the meaning of the law a person cannot stand in loco parentis to an adult unless such adult is mentally or physically incapacitated. No man who was mentally or physically incapacitated was accepted for service in the military or naval forces. Inasmuch as Private Deluca was an adult at the time of the commencement of his service, his age having been 30 years and 7 months, no person could have stood in loco parentis to him for the year prior to his entry into the service. Therefore, I regret to advise that Mrs. Scrapino is ineligible within the meaning of the law, to make this pilgrimage at the expense of the Government.






