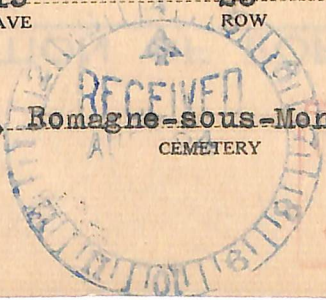

If data concerning co-ordinates is approximate and NOT accurate, statement to this effect will be made on these forms.

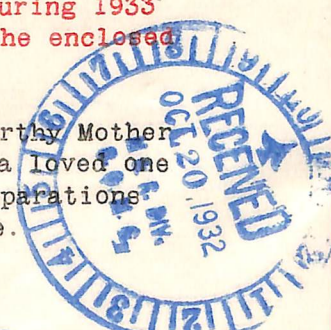

The Act of Congress which provides for pilgrimages to cemeteries in Europe by mothers and widows of members of the military or naval forces of the United States who died in the military or naval service at any time between April 5, 1917 and July 1, 1921, and whose remains are now interred in such cemeteries, all necessary expenses of which pilgrimages are to be paid by the United States Government, requires that the Secretary of War make an investigation and submit the results of such investigation in a report to Congress not later than December 15, 1929. The purpose of the investigation is to determine the total number of mothers and widows entitled to make the pilgrimages, the number of such mothers and widows who desire to make the pilgrimages, the number who desire to make the pilgrimages during the calendar year 1930 and the probable cost of the pilgrimages to be made.

A short time ago Mrs. Andrew DeMars of Faribault, Minnesota received a letter from your office enclosing a picture of the grave of her son (Andrew DeMars ~~mech.~~ Co. K 362nd Inf. U.S.A.) who was killed in action in France.

Mrs. DeMars has requested me to write you and state the following facts in reference to the above.

The picture of the grave sent her shows the name to be Andrew DeMart Pvt. Co K 362 Inf. U.S.A. Her son's name is Andrew De Mars. He was a Mechanic in Co. K 362nd Infantry.

At the time Mechanic DeMars was killed no trace was ever found of his body and he was reported "missing in action." Mrs. DeMars tried by every means possible to find out if the body was ever found and no report was made that it ever was. Finally she received a telegram from Washington that reported his as killed in action but the body never found.

She then wrote to several of the men in his company who were with him the morning he was killed and she received several letters from some of these men. Two of the men wrote her that her son Andrew was between them and was struck by a large shell and literally blown to pieces as they were each a witness to this. Now this being the case, how would it be possible that this body was buried and no report ever made to her of it, when she tried every means possible to learn if the body were ever found.

Mrs. DeMars is of the opinion that some mistake has been made and that this is not the body of her son.

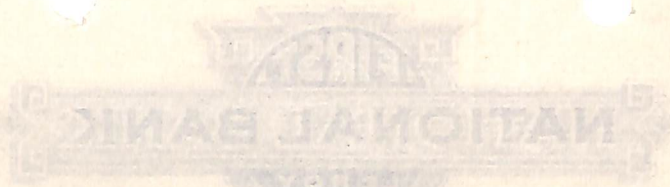
