
In view of the foregoing, identity in this case cannot be safely assumed without more thorough comparison of original burial records and tooth chart.

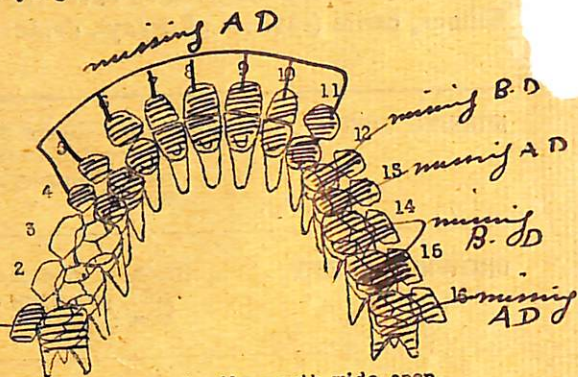


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.
