The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.





Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

2. Attention is invited to the following apparent discrepancies: The body taken from isolated Grave #1, Commune of Flumes, is reported to bear the tag reading: "Vincent--McC----Co. D, 103 Regt.U.S.A., 1255137, send for Priest". Rosary beads and two catholic medals found on body. The dental chart of this body checks with that of Stanley O. Dengler, while the dental chart of McConnon checks perfectly with the body taken from isolated Gr. #2, reported as bearing the tag reading: "Stan-----ngler Co.- Engrs. 103 Regt.,U.S.A. 1255168", U.S.N.G. and Engrs. collar ornaments on blouse.

3. It would appear that the tags were either transposed at the time of the original burial, or that the typewritten data on the G.R.S. Form 16-A, is entered with the wrong dental chart.

4. A check of this will be made and if necessary the bodies be re-examined.
