In the Chateau Thierry drive, while occupying a position in a narrow strip of wood, with our only protection trenches dug in the rear, Corporal Dennett was seriously wounded by shell fragments, in the midst of a terrific bombardment. He was seriously wounded in the hand and in the abdomen, while lying in a trench.

The position was seven kilometers East of Epieds. It happened about the middle of the afternoon, July 25, 1918. He was removed to an ambulance, under shell fire, and was taken to a hospital. He died October 8, 1918.
