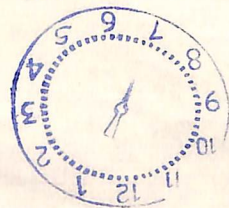

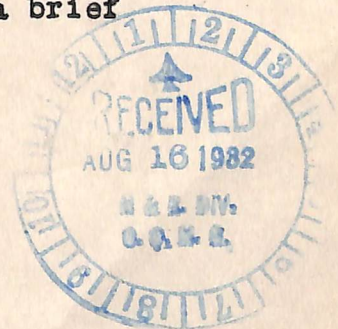

The Act of Congress of March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930, authorizes pilgrimages to the cemeteries Of Europe during the years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for the mothers and widows of deceased members of the American forces who were lost or buried at sea or whose remains are interred in Europe.

Your attention is particularly invited to the fact that this is the last opportunity you will have to make the pilgrimage under the provisions of the above mentioned Act. Unless you take advantage of this LAST chance to make a trip in 1933 you will receive no benefit from the Act. There is no provision of law which will permit the Government to make a money allowance to any mother or widow who does not choose to make the pilgrimage.



<p>DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."</p>

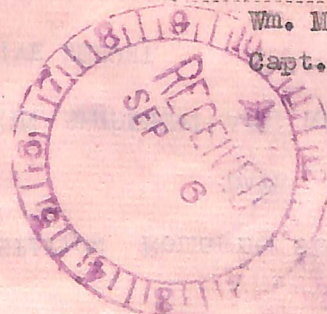

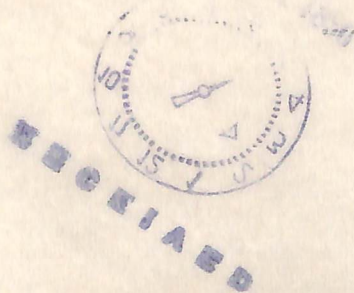

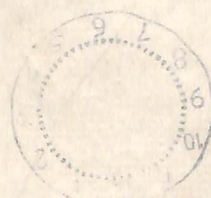

Would appreciate it very much if you would have this looked into, and furnish me with the location of his grave.

From the little information that I was able to obtain from his Company Headquarters, on the 7th of November, 1918, I believe that he must have been buried in the vicinity of Cunel. I found a number of graves of F. Company men along the road leading due east, towards, and about half-way, to Brioules, but was unable to locate his grave among the many that were scattered throughout that part of the line. We have held hopes all along that, in the absence of official information as to the location of his grave, that he might eventually return; having been in a hospital, or out of his mind, and been lost track of by the War Department. Therefore, you can understand that we are greatly interested in obtaining this information, as it will do away with the uncertainty.
