The goal is for students to latch on to reading and stick with it for the rest of their lives. In partnership with Conroe ISD, Hats Off to Reading is a festive and free event for all and is paired with a Woodlands Symphony concert aimed directly at concert-going kids.





**VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNTIES** Hats Off to Reading features a variety of activity stations that all require volunteers to oversee. These stations include everything from handing out books, coordinating themed games, applying temporary tattoos, making hats and more.
