- **Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV)** – Upon request by a person who has a developmental disability, or by a parent or legal guardian of a child or ward who has a developmental disability, the capital letter “D” can be exhibited on the driver license or identification card and/or the “SAFE” designation for a motor vehicle registration to alert

law enforcement and emergency personnel in a crisis or emergency situation.
