PLANNED GIVING: Key Tax Law Updates Recent federal tax legislation introduces several changes that will directly affect charitable giving beginning in 2026. The elevated standard deduction has been made permanent—\$15,750 for individuals and \$31,500 for married couples filing jointly in 2025, with adjustments for inflation in future years.

Cash gift deductions up to 60% of adjusted gross income (AGI) will also continue for

Two new provisions, however, may influence how you plan your giving over the next two years. Starting in 2026, itemizers will need to donate at least 0.5% of their AGI to

claim a charitable deduction, and top earners will see the value of their deduction

those who itemize. Beginning in 2026, non-itemizers will be able to deduct up to \$1,000 (individuals) or \$2,000 (married couples) in charitable gifts. The law also preserves the existing tax brackets and maintains a high federal estate and gift tax

exemption, which will rise to \$15 million per individual.
